

## Manatee Spotted Near Bluff Drive

Recently, Noel Wright a long-time Isle of Hope resident, spotted a Manatee in the marsh at high tide in front 61 Bluff Drive (Daniels). Here's what he saw:

"It was munching on marsh grass and gradually moving north. It was gigantic, in the 10 foot' range, weighing around 1,000 pounds. Its tail was approximately 3 feet wide. Several white spots were evident on its back, apparently minor healed wounds from propeller strikes. Its back was covered by a very dark mat of algae. It was not shy and would approach people on the docks without hesitation and would often roll over on its back in a playful fashion. It slowly moved past the marina and was last seen at my dock at 3 Bluff Drive."

Mr. Wright, who has lived on Isle of Hope since 1944, said this was the first time he had seen a manatee in the coastal area.

Interestingly, Clay George, a wildlife biologist with the Georgia Department of Natural Resources saw the manatee photos and shared this:

"Based on the white scars he appears to be a manatee known as BC-257 "2-Leaf." This is very exciting for 2 reasons. Firstly, he has been sighted in GA waters going back to 1997. Secondly, the last time he was photographed in GA was in 2009 at Thunderbolt Marine. At that time he was listing strongly to one side, which is often an indication of a recent boat strike. We were discussing rescuing him but he disappeared before we could respond. His sighting history up to that point was quite

consistent, so after a few years of no sightings I suspected he must have died."

When I followed up with Mr. George, he asked me to stress that people should never feed, play with or give water to manatees. He said, "manatees are docile and can be inquisitive, but they are still wild animals. Giving them food and water and water can cause them to be attracted to people, boats and docks, which places them at higher risk of injury from boat collisions. It's also illegal because manatees are listed as endangered under the Endangered Species Act."

Dr. David Tribble, the President of Bethesda Academy retired this year after 25 years. He recently penned a farewell to Bethesda in the Savannah Morning News. Here are a few of the highlights:

"I well remember the first time I saw Bethesda, known then as Bethesda Home for Boys. It was late 1990 and like many other potential suitors, I had still, does it? arrived on campus to interview for the job of executive director. The live oaks, Spanish moss, the Moon River,

the cattle and pastures all exuded a place where time stood still. It was easy to be mesmerized by the sheer beauty of Bethesda. It still is for that matter. However time does not really stand


Bethesda's timelessness is now mea-



sured in its relevance to the young men enrolled in our school, known today as Bethesda Academy."

## Make Smart Improvements That Pay Off

Do you want to increase the value of your home and/or sell it faster? Updates can help you do that, but if you don't invest in the right improvements you can spend money on things that have a high cost and low resale value. So here's a guick list of the best updates to make in 2016 according to Remodeling Magazine:

front door can increase the security and energy efficiency of your home. A steel door brings a 91% return on cost (\$1335 value vs. \$1217 cost), while a new fiberglass door returns about 82% (\$3126 vs. \$2574) of its cost

Deck - Wooden decks are more popular than composite decks, but both can increase the value of your home. Wooden decks raise the value of your home by \$7,850 and cost \$10,470. Composite decks return 64% or

## Summer Break: Help Your Child Retain What They've Learned


