Isle of Hope Art and Music Fest Returns

Turtle Watching on Ossabaw Island

Each summer, loggerhead turtles crawl up to the sand dune line on Ossabaw Island and other beaches up and down Georgia's coast, to lay eggs in hundreds of nests. Two months later, turtle hatchlings emerge and make a dash for the ocean, in hopes of survival and a return to Georgia's coast many years later, to lay nests themselves.

Ossabaw Island, located at the southern tip of Chatham County, is the third largest barrier island on Georgia's coast. Because Ossabaw is set aside as a heritage preserve and protected from development, its nearly deserted beaches provide ideal grounds for hundreds of turtle nests each year.

At press time, 304 turtle nests were laid on Ossabaw Island so far in 2017, and over 50 nests have already hatched. The Georgia Department of Natural Resources Sea Turtle Conservation Program monitors nests on every barrier island, including Ossabaw, using interns who document the location of each nest and false crawl, and many other factors relating to the nest.

For the past several summers, the Ossabaw Island Foundation has hosted a Turtle Hatching Weekend (or two) open to the general public. Participants spend a day on Ossabaw's beach, accompanying the turtle intern as he/she collects data on recently hatched nests.

Elizabeth DuBose, Executive Director of the Ossabaw Island Foundation answered some questions about the Ossabaw turtle trips.

Q: What can a visitor expect to see and do on an Ossabaw Island Foundation turtle trip?



A: We get into the back of a pickup truck early in the morning, and with [Isle of Hope resident] John "Crawfish" Crawford as our guide, we travel approximately eight miles to the beach. It takes about an hour-and-ahalf to get there.

Along the way, Crawfish will tell you everything about a barrier island--the flora, the fauna, the geology. He is able to answer any question you would have about a Georgia barrier island and its eco system. At the beach, we meet up with a turtle intern. At this point in the season the interns are beginning to excavate hatched nests.

Q: Excavate the turtle nest? What does that mean?

A. All of the turtle nests are tagged and dated the same day that they are laid. About 65 days later, the intern will remove any hog and raccoon protection, [installed by the (continued on p. 11)

intern the morning after the nest was initially laid], and will dig the nest cavity out that the turtle dug. In the digging, the intern will collect casings of hatched eggs, and count the number of turtle eggs that are hatched, or that did not develop, or hatchlings that did not survive. At this point, if we are very lucky, we will encounter live hatchlings that are stragglers.

Any live hatchlings the intern will take onto the beach. It's important for the hatchling to imprint where it is by crawling on the beach to the water. The hatchling has to find the water on his own. The sun is out, so the turtle is going towards the sun. It's important that people don't' interfere with its path, but we can watch. Sometimes the path is wobbly--they are going the wrong way, or are crawling parallel to the water. The temptation is to put them into the water, but that is not allowed. When

they do find the water they immediately start swimming frantically. Even if they seem tired on the beach, as soon as they hit the water they are rejuvenated. They take breaths and swim out to sea.

Q: What kinds of data are collected by the interns?

A: Well, this year we have three generations of turtles nesting on Ossabaw. How do we know? From the data collected by the interns! For many years, one egg from each nest has been removed within 12 hours of laying. The interns send the egg casing to a lab at University of Georgia, as part of a research program covering Georgia's and South Carolina's sea turtles. In three months the DNA data is processed at UGA and sent back to Ossabaw, on the mother's DNA history/family. From that DNA we know that this summer we have three generations of turtles. Turtles



must be at least 35 years old to lay eggs. That means that the grandmother is 70 years older than the granddaughter,

who is at least 35 years old.

Every time we watch a hatchling crawl to the ocean we hope that it is the one in 4,000 that survives to adulthood, and that it will return to Ossabaw to nest 35 years later, to lay her first nest.

Education Matters: Test Prep 101

In today's competitive college admissions environment, doing well on the SAT[™] and ACT[™] may seem a daunting task. Prepare

Use Your Guidance Counselor Many students don't make adequate use of their school's academic guidance office. Throughout your high school

career, counselors can tell you all you need to know about college and SAT and ACT admissions tests, as well as give you expert advice on which classes to take to reach your goals.

Research & Target Colleges

Most colleges accept both the ACT and the SAT, but be aware that some of your targeted schools may accept only one of them, or strongly prefer one over the other.



Test Prep 101

Before you take admission tests, it's important to collect as much information as you can on the colleges you are interested in to see which test they prefer, and how they use it in conjunction with career, with other factors such as GPA, extracurricular activities and work experience. Do this early enough to allow yourself time to prepare for and take both tests if you decide to do so.

Practice & Know Your Test

Take practice tests to gain an understanding of how the tests work and how they are structured. Math also accounts for more on the SAT - 50 percent, compared to 25 percent for the ACT.

Do The Math

Whether you intend to major in English or engineering, math remains an important indicator of your ability to think in a structured and logical way - a key factor that colleges examine when considering your admission application.

Even if you excel on other sections of the SAT or ACT, a poor or mediocre showing in
