Lemburg Named SVA Valedictorian

The people that are the closest to me know that over the past few years I have been absolutely obsessed with something: a super underground artist named Vincent van Gogh.

My planner this year has been van Gogh's *Starry Night*. The wallpaper on my computer and phone are both two different van Gogh paintings. I have gone to see the van Gogh Immersive Experience in Atlanta. I am going to the van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam this summer. I have listened to *Starry: The Musical*, a musical about Vincent and Theo van Gogh that was released as an original concept recording in 2020, countless times on Spotify. So in other words, I have a slight obsession.

While I absolutely adore the visual aesthetic of his paintings, the main reason I love van Gogh so much is because of the man himself behind the works of art. I am deeply moved by the story of a person who saw the world through a different lens because of the brokenness inside of him. Van Gogh used art as a way to deal with the negative feelings of loneliness, fear, and depression inside of him. His artistic career only lasted about ten years, and

sent me about my bucket list? I say yes. He says I have pretty much done everything I wanted to do.

How Does Inflation Affect Interest Rates?

Lately, I've been getting tons of questions about inflation. How does inflation affect interest rates? Why is inflation such a big deal for interest rates? Why are interest rates going up?

This is a VERY complex subject VERY! But, I'm going to try to explain it to you simply! First, let's look at the **WHY?**

We have to understand the two main parties involved: the lender and the borrower. The lenders are the people (creditors or investors) who are giving up their money to lend out, and the second group is the borrower. In exchange for lending out their money, the lenders will want something in return, which is the interest rate they charge. And the borrower will pay the interest rate to get the cash they need. Very basic!

Five factors make up interest rates:

- Risk-Free Rate
- Premium
- Expected Inflation Premium
- Default-Risk Premium
- Liquidity Premium
- Maturity Premium

These five factors make up the interest you are charged on everything — EVERY TIME YOU BORROW MONEY!

Risk-Free Rate Premium represents what return an investor would expect from an absolutely risk-free investment over a specified time period. Examples: Triple-A bonds or US Treasury Bonds.

ExpectedInflationPremium is what lendersexpect current and future

inflation to be. The lender will have their purchasing power reduced by the inflation rate over the period of time you borrow the money, so they charge a premium. For example, if we have 10% inflation, then in a year, \$1000 will have the purchasing power of \$900. So the \$1000 lent to you will only be worth \$900 in one year.

Default-Risk Premium is the premium charged by the lender for the risk that the borrower might default or not make timely payments. This is where your credit score comes into play—the higher your credit score, the lower your default risk.

Liquidity Premium is when someone lends you money, you receive a note or security deed. Liquidity Premium is the ability of the lender to convert this security back to cash. Can they sell the security to get cashed out early? Less liquidity = higher interest rates. More liquidity = lower rates.

Maturity Premium In general, the longer you borrow money, the higher the interest rate. In other words, short-term = lower rate and long-term = higher rate. So typically, a one-year loan will have a lower premium than a 30year loan.

In summary, rates are low when the economy **LOOKS ROSY!** When we have jobs, money, and a positive outlook! The FUTURE LOOKS bright! But, when it seems gloomy or negative, we pay more to borrow money! Here perception can become reality and cause the economy to contract. There is a ton more going on here.

But, I wanted to give you a quick understanding of how inflation and interest rates work and why we as consumers might be paying more for goods and services.

Native Savannahians and those in Athens in the 90s likely know these guys already. Stewart Marshall and Winfield Smith started picking and singing together in 1989. They both went to UGA and used to play at all the old venues, 40 Watt, Uptown, and the now-defunct TK Harty's.

Whenever they play in Savannah, I try to check them out. I guess it reminds me of the good ole days in Athens, but I also love their sound. Stewart calls it "y'all-ternative" music, which roughly translates to "harmony-driven roots rock."

No matter what you call the music, it is a rousing good time when they play live, particularly at the Isle of Hope Marina with the backdrop of the Skidaway River.

Stewart grew up in the Sandfly area and fell in love with albums like Waylon & Willie's Wanted! The Outlaws and Simon & Garfunkel's Concert in Central Park. He spun the records a lot along with bluegrass greats like Emmylou Harris and Sam Bush. Rock legends like the Beatles, Stones, Dylan, and CCR also influenced the band.

Some folks from the Savannah Economic Development sat nearby and were looking for an acoustic group to play an event at the Westin. So as serendipity would have it, Stewart and Winfield got

the gig.



The struggles faced with his own human emotion allowed him to view and depict the world in a unique way that still moves people over a hundred years after his death. The creativity within allowed him to look past the darkness inside in order to see the light present in the outside world.

There are many times in my life that I have felt very akin to van Gogh because of the shared nature of enduring struggles. One of these times in particular was in 8th grade, when I wanted to go to Savannah Arts for high school. According to my classmates at the K through 8 school that I had just started at during that same year, that was the place to go when it came to high school. I struggled a little in deciding what I wanted to audition for as a major, but I eventually

concluded that I wanted to try out in the visual arts department.

Then, I spent months and months preparing with the art teacher at my school and making dozens of pieces in all of my spare time. I found

While I was devastated in the moment, now, I am so incredibly thankful that I did not get in to Savannah Arts. I believe that I would have done well there, but I know in my heart that St. Vincent's was where I needed to go.

SVA has taught me how to be a woman who leads, how to stay true to myself, numerous academic lessons, and what values I hold most dear. Now that my time here has almost ended,

I can see that the darkness surrounding me during that time would eventually reveal a beautiful light seen only from the other side. I think that we should all live our lives like Vincent van Gogh. We should rely on those who support us; to find the love of Theo van Gogh in our family, friends, teachers, and neighbors. We should be creative in every moment that we can.

And, in hard situations, we should persevere in order to see the beauty on the other side. One of Vincent's many quotes is "One of the hardest things to do is to paint darkness which nonetheless has light in it". In other words, the most difficult thing that a person can do is to look for the good when we are stuck in the bad. Yet, that is what we must do in life, or else we may succumb to our own brokenness.

Throughout life, we all undergo many hardships. We struggle with making new friends at a brand new school. We are forced to recover from injuries and illnesses. We face our own inner demons telling us that "nobody likes you" or "you are a failure."
