dances they've learned. The ages run from 4 years old to adults. The intricate footwork and the dancing will transport you back to Scotland.

Pipe and drum competition returns to the games this year. The thrilling and haunting music of the bagpipe is the soul of Scotland. Coupled with the drums, the sound of bagpipes becomes even more enthralling. Come to hear the mesmerizing sounds for yourself and see if you don't agree.

Music lovers can also enjoy phenomenal performances by other Celtic bands, including Lochlann. These musicians sing and harmonize Scottish and Irish songs accompanied by fiddles, recorders, flutes, guitars, and the bodhran. More Celtic entertainment will be added to the lineup soon!

The Scottish Games also has many activities for the wee ones. They may encounter Zephyr, a mythical fairy, and then listen to a wide selection of Scottish tales told by Linda Bandiller. Children can participate in

games such as sheaf toss, caber toss, haggis hurl, stone throw, welly toss, and a sack race. A children's kilted run is held on the athletic field immediately following opening ceremonies. Children may also do crafts, coloring, and other games. Lads and lassies can get a Games Passport at the front gate. If they fill it with stamps or signatures from each clan tent, their full passport can be redeemed for a prize at the information tent.

Don't miss the Border Collies. These incredibly intelligent and responsive dogs were first bred on the boundary between Scotland and England from breeds brought to the area by Vikings. In old Gaelic, collie

meant "useful." Scotland has more sheep than humans, so the sheep-herding Collies became known as the "useful breed." Come and watch them in action. They are always a crowd favorite.

Want more action? The Shire of Fort Castle, a group of medieval reenactors, provides interactive demonstrations of medieval activities, such armed combat, dance, as juggling, and more. From these reenactors, you can learn ancient arts like calligraphy, metalworking, armoring, and more. Another group of reenactors, Clan Nom Con. composed of dedicated

Wormsloe opened its new visitor center to the public after nearly four years of construction on January 4, 2024. The 6,000-square-foot building includes a spacious porch with a fireplace, a 2,000-square-foot gift shop, a meeting space, and an introduction to the site. The building was the first capital improvement to Wormsloe in

25 years.

The construction also used repurposed materials from the Barrow's private residence on the grounds. Slate roofing from a historic dock is located on the wall behind the Wormsloe sign in the gift shop. An iron gate from a 1930s formal garden hangs above the outdoor fireplace on the patio.

In the next two years, the old visitor center will be transformed into a museum.

Wormsloe, the oldest

property in Georgia to be held continuously by the same family, also houses a private residence on 50 acres of the grounds. Craig and Diana Barrow are the ninth generation to live at Wormsloe since Noble Jones founded the colonial estate in the mid-1730s. In 1972, Wormsloe was put on the National Register of Historic Places. The Barrow family donated the property

to The Nature Conservancy, which transferred the land to the state of Georgia the same year. Wormsloe, managed by the Department of Natural Resources, is the most visited historic site in Georgia. Nearly 200,000 visitors come each year.


Gretchen Greminger, the Historic Site Manager since August 2016, explained some of the changes resulting from the new Visitor Center. Trolleys, similar to the ones used on Jekyll Island, will transport quests from the Visitor Center down the 1.5mile avenue canopied by Live Oaks. Tour guides will introduce newcomers to Wormsloe and its history on the way. Wormsloe implemented the trolley system to preserve the most iconic, oak-lined road in the country.



"Everyone wants that spectacular photo of Wormsloe's Avenue of Live Oaks," said manager Gretchen Greminger. "Cars would not be in the way, and guests could take their time. They could even walk the entire avenue, just enjoying the shade and Spanish moss."

"Reducing car traffic would also protect these majestic trees," said Greminger. "Our visitation has grown quickly, and the weight of vehicles pulling off to the side of the road can damage roots and compact the soil."

Although you can no longer drive down the most photographed street in the country, you can walk or bike down it. Wormsloe will offer bicycle rentals and you can bring your bike. The 3-mile Battery Trail (Orange) will be opened to bikers.

New native plants, young cypress trees, live oaks, and a water feature have been added to the site. Of course, you can still explore Wormsloe's 268 acres which includes almost six miles of nature trails, tabby ruins, and an area that portrays life during colonial times.

Wormsloe has returned to having 400 Live Oak trees planted with the help of the Savannah Tree Foundation, The Rotary Club of Savannah, and the Friends of Wormsloe. The Friends of Wormsloe is a group of local volunteers who work to promote, support, improve, and preserve Wormsloe State Historic Site. Wormsloe receives a \$2.50 donation if volunteers log their hours through the organization.

The site hosts several events throughout the year, including the "Colonial Faire and Muster" in February, which highlights aspects of 18th-century life, such as music, dancing, crafts, and military drills.

You can purchase a Historic Site Annual Pass. This pass provides unlimited admission to Wormsloe and all of Georgia's state historic sites. You can buy the passes online at gastateparks.org/ ThingsToKnow or the Wormsloe gift shop.

historians and reenactors mainly from Georgia, North Carolina, and Florida. They focus on studying and representing Scottish Highlanders of the 1736-1746 era. Scottish Highlanders were known as some of the best soldiers. Due to their reputation, most of General James Oglethorpe's troops for his mission to Fort King George in Darien in 1736 were Scottish Highlanders.

If you've ever wondered if you have a bit of the Scots in you or are interested in a specific clan or clans in general, visit the many clan tents surrounding the Scottish Games arena, Each tent offers a wide variety of artifacts, history, and listings of surnames associated with their clan. There's also a genealogy tent where regional experts and different historical associations will help you dive into your past and trace your family tree. But watch out. Genealogy is a worthwhile adventure that can become an addiction.

The Scottish Games also has food and beverage vendors offering traditional Scottish foods, American foods, sweets, craft beers, and mead. The Scottish Marketplace has 15 or so vendors who sell goods made by Scots with Scottish materials, some even made in Scotland. You can also buy a T-shirt commemorating the event.

Mark your calendar for May 4th. The Savannah Scottish Games begin at 8:30 a.m. and culminate with the Closing Ceremony at 4:30 p.m. See you there!


