

A Whale of a Tale to Tell "Smoke", the North Atlantic Right Whale

Looking for an exciting adventure to take with your family?? Read on!

"Smoke", a thirty foot sculpture of a giant North Atlantic Right Whale is now mounted on a wall in the Marine Science Center at the north end of Tybee. Its tail has been painted in three dimensions to appear as it is disappearing into the wall making this creature appear as it is dramatically bursting from the wall.

The huge mouth, complete with baleen for straining plankton and prey from the water, is wide open in pursuit of prey. Large videos nearby show scenes of whales jumping and splashing in the oceans.

Baleen, a durable material used before modern plastics were invented, was need-

ed for skirt hoops and corset stays. This was the beginning of the whale population demise. Sadly today, it is enormous ships exceeding the speed limit causing fatal whale strikes and also water pollution and entanglement in fishing nets doing untold damage.

In March, 300 people welcomed "Smoke" at the museum with a rousing reception, delicious food stations, speeches and guides explaining the many live displays in huge aquariums...horseshoe crabs, blowfish, curious octopus, alligator garfish, loggerhead turtles, hermit crabs, snails, sea stars, baby alligators, flounders, corn snakes and so much more. Displays are always evolving. A boardwalk leads to the beach where folks can see ships far out to sea on the horizon, listen to the chattering seagulls and relax with a picnic.

A rare treat is a Creature

Cam showing tiny live invertebrates up close in detail. Their beauty and fascination are captured clearly on a monitor. "Oohs" and "Ahhs" and squeals of delight and wonder can be heard from the excited visitors!

These whales are the most endangered whales on the planet. It is estimated that there are only about 350 North Atlantic Right Whales left in our oceans, placing them on the brink of tragic extinction.

Joy Davis, a marine biologist from Ohio, worked with volunteers for one entire year to create this impressive model of "Smoke". Many of these creatures are a whopping forty-two feet in total length, the size of a large school bus!

Joy explained, "The coolest part of this mission is that Smoke's mother, Phoenix,





Chantal adds, "Our science center works to instill into every student and visitor a stewardship for animals on coastal Georgia. We introduce people to creatures in endangered populations to create a connection, passion and call-to-action to protect and conserve these species."


