IOH Sharks: "UN-UN-UNDEFEATED!!!

When temperatures begin to rise at Isle of Hope each vear, there is undeniable evidence that Shark Season is again upon us. Shark signs appear on the causeway and in front yards across the island. Just before 8 a.m. each morning, young Shark pups begin to converge on Paxton Park from all directions – some on foot, others on bikes, a few in golf carts, more in minivans, with some Segway riders sprinkled in between. By summertime standards, these Sharklings are up early, not only because Sharks never sleep, but also because morning practice for the defending

to overly active days with too much to do, especially if you have kids.


I'm glad I live somewhere I can experience all the seasons (and winter comes and goes quickly).



have a "flopsweat" of Sharks, but you cannot have a "shiver." Perhaps the best name WIN standards for a group of Sharks is a "frenzy" of Sharks - an extreme aquatic agitation, a temporary watery delirium characterized by splashing, thrashing, and furor. Swap "fun" for "furor" and you have the perfect definition for a group of Isle of Hope Sharks.

For almost three months, a "frenzy" of Isle of Hope Sharks practiced early in the morning and late in the afternoon to attempt a repeat of last year's city championship. 





ABOUT THE DAILY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Charles S. Daily was born on October 27, 1905 in the City of Islip, located on Long Island, New York. He attended Islip High School and then Catholic University at Georgetown, where he earned a degree in electrical engineering. Following college, he worked for several years for Consolidated Edison. In 1936, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy. While in the Navy, he married Marcella O'Shay on May 23, 1941.

Prior to the outbreak of World War II, he was in Northern Ireland building docks for the Navy. During World War II, he served as an aid to Admiral Spruance. He saw action in Hawaii and Italy. He was a graduate of the Navy War College. In June of 1960, Captain Daily retired from the Navy as a Captain of the Civil Engi-

neer Corps and moved to Savannah, Georgia. He worked for a number of years for the City of Savannah as Director of the Department of Public Improvement. Captain Daily was a member of the National Society of Professional Engineers, the Retired Officers Association, the Military Order of World Wars, and the Society of Military Engineers. He was a long-time member of the St. James Catholic Church.

Under Captain Daily's will, a Charitable Trust was created to promote causes which were important to him. A portion of the income generated by this Trust will help support St. Joseph's Candler Hospital, the St. James Catholic Church, and the Charles S. Daily Scholarship Fund. During Captain Daily's long career, he was

often involved in training and teaching young people. As an engineer, he wanted to help steer young people toward this avocation. Since his wife had been a physical education major and then taught elementary school and coached high school basketball, he selected physical education as another area of emphasis.

This scholarship program is established to provide college financial assistance to high school graduates of Islip High School, Benedictine Military School, and Savannah Country Day School. The scholarship is not based on financial need. Preference may be given to those who intend to major in engineering or physical education.






