St. Thomas Thrift Store Awards \$48,900 in Grants

The St. Thomas Thrift Store, a mission of St. Thomas Episcopal Church on Isle of Hope, presented \$48,900 in grants for nine projects around Chatham County during a grant party on Monday, February 24.

The Thrift Store has operated for 27 years, giving over \$800,000 in grants to locally run nonprofit organizations in the Savannah Chatham County community. Recently, the grants have focused on early childhood literacy and well-being

for underserved children in the Savannah Chatham County community. Dave White and the Grant Committee, Paige Case, and Liz Ann Roberts researched and reviewed the grant applications submitted this year.

The Thrift Store, run by 35 volunteers, is located at 1126 E. Montgomery Cross Road, open 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Friday, and accepts gently used furniture, clothing, housewares, jewelry, shoes, and books.

Millie Green, the Chairman of the Board of Directors, and Stacie Bacon, the Treasurer, live on Isle of Hope and attend St. Thomas Church.










Are We About to Get Hit with Automatic Tax Hikes? Understanding HB 581 in Chatham County

House Bill 581 (HB 581) is a new law affecting property taxes across Georgia. While it promises tax relief, its impact on Chatham County is different because of the Stephens-Day Homestead Exemption.

For weeks, I've tried to get clear answers, and now we have them. The good news? Opting in or out will NOT reset anyone's base tax year. If you already have Stephens-Day, your taxable value stays frozen unless you sell, transfer, or improve your property. The bad news? If we opt in, future tax increases will happen automatically. You won't be able to stop them and your property taxes will never go down even if your property value goes down.

This article breaks down what HB 581 does, how it compares to Stephens-Day, and why this matters for you.

What Is HB 581?

HB 581 is a statewide property tax exemption aimed at limiting tax increases caused by rising property values. Instead of freezing taxable values like Stephens-Day, HB 581 caps increases at the rate of inflation.

Key points:

- Floating Homestead Exemption: Taxable values increase annually based on inflation.
- Local Decision: Counties, cities, and school districts must opt out by March 1, 2025, or HB 581 takes effect automatically.
- No Reset for Current Homeowners: If you already have Stephens-Day, your taxable value remains frozen unless you sell or renovate.
- New Homebuyers Affected: Those who buy homes after 2025 will be placed under HB 581's system instead of Stephens-Day.

How Does HB 581 Compare to Stephens-Day?

Chatham County has benefited from Stephens-Day since 1999, keeping taxable values frozen at the year a homeowner qualifies.

• Under Stephens-Day: Property taxes stay locked in, only changing if millage rates increase. • Under HB 581: Taxes increase every year, even if home values go down.

What If Inflation Goes Up but Home Prices Go Down?

This is where HB 581 becomes a real problem for homeowners.

Example Scenario:

- Home prices drop 20%, but inflation is 6% → HB 581 still increases your taxable value by 6%.
- If inflation is negative, your taxable value does NOT go down—you'd have to file an appeal to get it reassessed.

HB 581 locks you into automatic tax increases, regardless of what happens in the housing market.

What Would Have Happened If HB 581 Was in Place During the 2008 Housing Crash?

From 2008 to 2011, home values plummeted by 33%, but inflation still existed.

- If HB 581 had been in effect: Taxable values would have increased every year, even as home-owners lost equity.
- Homeowners would have paid more in taxes despite their homes being worth less.

Year	Home Market Value	Taxable Value (Stephens-Day)	Inflation Adjustment
2007 (Pre-Crash)	\$300,000	\$300,000	-
2008	\$246,000 (-18%)	\$300,000	No increase
2009	\$221,400 (-10%)	\$300,000	No increase
2010	\$210,330 (-5%)	\$300,000	No increase
2011	\$206,123 (-2%)	\$300,000	No increase

Stephens-Day protected homeowners during that crash, and my property taxes have decreased numerous times. HB 581 would not have.

Year	Home Market Value	Taxable Value (Under HB 581)	Inflation Adjustment
2007 (Pre-Crash)	\$300,000	\$300,000	
2008	\$246,000 (-18%)	\$311,520 (+3.84%)	Taxes go up
2009	\$221,400 (-10%)	\$310,400 (-0.36%)	Taxes stay nearly the same
2010	\$210,330 (-5%)	\$315,488 (+1.64%)	Taxes go up
2011	\$206,123 (-2%)	\$325,474 (+3.16%)	Taxes go up

Homeowners would have paid more in taxes despite their homes being worth less. HB 581 removes local control and forces automatic tax increases.

Will My Taxes Go Up Under HB 581?

If Chatham County opts in:

- Stephens-Day remains for existing homeowners, but new buyers go under HB 581.
- Property taxes increase annually based on inflation.

If Chatham County opts out:

- Stephens-Day remains the only exemption.
- No automatic tax increases—only changes if millage rates go up.

Final Takeaway: Should Chatham County Opt In or Keep Stephens-Day?

Do You Want Tax Increases You Can Fight or Ones You Can't Stop?

- Stephens-Day = You have a voice. If taxes increase, elected officials must vote for a millage rate increase, and you can hold them accountable.
- HB 581 = No control. Taxes go up automatically every year—even if your home loses value.

Keeping Stephens-Day is the safer choice for protecting homeowners.


