As children, Laura Connerat (Lawton) and Polly Wylly (Cooper) grew up in Ardsley Park jumping rope, riding push-mobiles and climbing trees. They are now in their 80s and still best buddies.

As teens they wanted to be writers. The Savannah Morning News assigned them to cover cocktail parties. They called their first column "A Glance Askance." The name was rejected. They renamed it "A View Askew!" It ended up as ... "Laura and Polly Say."

Both girls badly wanted a horse and bought a skinny old nag for \$25. The poor animal collapsed when Polly got boosted onto her back. They fattened her up with alfalfa hay and oats and taught her to pull water skis at Tybee. She lived three happy years with their lavish pampering.

Both were debutantes in 1959. Johnny Mercer, famous songwriter of "Moon River", "You Must've Been a Beautiful Baby", and thousands more, had a huge party for them in the old Desoto Hotel with two bands. Then, they both went off to different colleges.

They've written six local history books together, including the just-released, Bethesda Davs Adventures in the Orphanage. This fascinating book walks you through the history of one of Savannah's most beloved

institutions. The Bethesda Home for Boys. In the Prologue. Noel Wright shares some memories of Bethesda and its boys, including this anecdote from 1943.

"The mighty Tigers with our fancy jerseys, shoes, and pads lined up on one side of the field with the ragged Bethesda boys facing us. We were surprised to learn they had no uniforms, pads or shoes. We were smug enough to think we would run mercilessly all over them.

Both teams waited breathlessly for the kick-off whistle. When it shrilled, the reality dawned on us mighty Tigers. The playing field was full of stickers (cockspurs). The barefoot Bethesda boys sprinted over them like Brer Rabbit in the briar patch. When we were tackled to the ground, we jumped up with painful cockspurs jabbing into our tender skin! Our enthusiasm for the game vanished.

Bethesda was jubilant over their overwhelming victory!" Following that, Laura and Polly introduce the tale of George Whitefield and James Habersham traveling to Georgia to start the orphanage:

"Two young men gripped on to the railing of the deck of the ship Whitaker as the waves crashed against the prow. They had left their native England two months earlier, on December 28, 1737, and were approaching a new and strange land with a purpose given them by God. Their intent was to provide a place for orphaned children in the new colony of Georgia, not realizing that the institution they established would continue until the present day."

The two men laid the orphanage's first brick on March 25, 1740. Bethesda, meaning House of Mercy in Hebrew, still stands on Ferguson Avenue on the same 500 acres of land that the trustees of Georgia granted 285 years ago.

Rev. Whitefield, a well-known and flamboyant Methodist preacher, traveled around the country to preach and raise money for Bethesda. When he died, he left the orphanage to Lady Huntingdon in his will. She had been an avid supporter of Whitefield's ministry and the Savannah orphanage throughout her lifetime. Unfortunately, she was never able to visit Bethesda in Savannah.

Laura and Polly also share the stories of many key leaders, teachers, and mentors—like Ole Burroughs, who served as Superintendent from 1915 to 1945. They bring to life some of Bethesda's most memorable characters — the boys — ranging from Barney Diamond, its most generous alumnus, to the eccentric Arthur Brannan. The book also features a rich collection of photos from Bethesda's history, including several never published before.



highly talented and skilled man who worked for years at the Isle of Hope Marina as a boat mechanic. He also repaired yachts traveling along the inland waterway from north to




south.



Martin de Porres Society Lifts Up Savannah's Underserved Youth

The Martin de Porres Society, a non-profit founded in 1986 by Dr. George Negron and his wife, Yolanda Negron, is rooted in Christian values and inspired by the legacy of its patron saint, Saint Martin de Porres. The Society was born from the Negrons' vision to carry on Martin de Porres' mission. Now their daughter, Maria Verwiel, continues that tradition.

The Patron Saint of the Societv served as a Dominican lav brother in 17th-century Peru. He was known for his humility, charitable work among the poor, and defiance of social barriers in 17th-century Peru. De Porres founded an orphanage and a children's hospital while championing social justice. Now, he serves as a powerful symbol for the Society's present-day outreach efforts supporting the educational, social, and emotional needs of children and families in underserved communities in Savannah. GA.

The Society fulfills this mission through Camp Lighthouse, a summer experience fusing creative arts and life skills training. This past summer Red Gates Farm hosted the summer camp for 100 children and volunteers. The organization also provides, among other things, structured developmental mentorship through Leaders in Training (LIT) Mentoring, in-school tutorial

services, and back-to-school initiatives that give school supplies to children in the local schools.

This year, the Society will host its 33rd Annual Christmas Blessing on December 19th, bringing together various individuals and community organizations to present toys, games, and books to 200 underserved children in the Savannah area.

The Martin de Porres Society invites you to join them and

A Dance, featuring Latin and Decade dances, which will take place at the Isle of Hope Marina on November 8th. Followed by a fundraising Gala, featuring the Equinox Orchestra, at The Landings Palmetto Club on March 21, 2026. 
